## Characteristics of **Bullies**:

- ✓ Aggressive personality pattern
- ✓ May have a positive attitude toward violence
- ✓ Older and stronger than their peers
- ✓ Come from unhealthy family situations
- ✓ Need for attention and control
- ✓ Substance abuse

*Characteristics of the Bullied*—Generally, *anybody* who is perceived to be different from their peers, including:

Sexual Abuse
Overview
• Can include incest, voyeurism, sexting, sexual jokes/advances/touching, child pornography, rape, indecent exposure
Known as the "" because
<ul> <li>About 75% of all sexual assaults or attacks are committed by people the victim knows</li> </ul>
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<ul> <li>Victims of sexual abuse are most often young females, especially those under the age of 18</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Males are victims of sexual abuse though at much lower numbers; they tend to be young and/or of different sexual orientations/gender identities</li> </ul>
Battery or beating may be used in conjunction with sexual abuse
• Substance abuse by the assailant and/or victim often factors into the occurrence of sexual abuse
Violence
• Tend to be isolated events toward people or property frequently unfamiliar to the assailant
Causes may include:
– Prejudices
<ul> <li>Substance abuse</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Poverty or basic needs not met</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Unsuccessful efforts to resolve a conflict</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Mental illness or controlling personalities</li> </ul>
•—a person who commits a violent act against another
—violence committed for no particular reason: usually involves an innocent

Factors Affecting Violence

Availability of weapons

bystander (homeless)

- Law Enforcement
- Territoriality (i.e. gangs, invading nations)
- Substance abuse
- Media (movies, TV, music lyrics, video games, websites/blogs, books/magazines, etc.)

## *How can we* reduce *violence?*

- Stop, think, breath. Use the Decision-Making/Problem-Solving Model
- Strict gun control laws and regulation?
- Censoring and parental control over media?
- Avoid prejudices, stereotypes and judgmental thinking; practice tolerance and respect
- Practice good communication skills
- Avoid substance abuse and those who abuse substances
- Practice healthy means of stress management



- Report assailants to proper authorities whether you're a victim or a witness
- Don't let violence be "okay" (In other words, being apathetic. Boo!)
